



The Immediate Scene Concerns • Don't change: Make entry and neutralize threat(s) • This is for the responding officers of any rank, on-duty, off-duty, etc. • Until the threat is neutralized and the scene secure, there is no such thing as "too many" officers on scene • Once the threat is neutralized and scene secure, manpower needs to be reduced within the structure to – • Those necessary to assist victims • Those necessary to secure the scene



Predirecting Personnel Until the threat is neutralized, the first officer on scene is in command. Once the threat is neutralized, the senior officer on scene takes command. Once the scene is secure, a command hierarchy is put in place to manage the immediate scene and all of the necessary rally points. Managing people – officers of all types, witnesses, bystanders, etc. becomes the biggest challenge.





Every location you use as a rally point will need a management or supervisory level officer responsible for that location How many locations are necessary: Reunification: for students to be reunited with their parents/guardians and transported home Witnesses: for those students, staff and faculty who are or may be witnesses to the events and need to be interviewed Media: speaks for itself. Needs a command staff level agency member if available and a Press Information Officer if the agency has one Elected Representatives/Politicians: Will want to go to the media rally point but should be staged at a different location so media interaction can be coordinated and managed

Command Post & Personnel Management Command Post should be located within reasonable distance of the event location and in such a place that unauthorized personnel can be kept away from it. Communications connections Utility connections Parking availability Available (potentially) for a week Personnel Management: Coordinating manpower – on-duty, off-duty, volunteer, allied agency, etc. will become a full time responsibility Should be managed by primary agency or trusted allied command officer familiar with primary agency capabilities, etc.

Needs to be large enough to hold all personnel from primary location; perhaps another school of equal or higher grade range high school for other high school or lower, etc Needs to have plenty of parking for responding parents, guardians Needs to be manned by officers to direct traffic and control access Needs to be manned by officer(s) and school personnel with lists of who has come in, who has been reunited, and who took custody of them


Needs to be large enough to hold all potential witnesses Needs to have space for parents to wait with students while interviews are being arranged Needs to have private rooms/offices available for witness interviews Needs to be manned for security purposes Needs to be manned by officer/school personnel to track who enters and exists, who has been interviewed and what students are released into whose custody

Politicians Staging Area Needs to be conveniently located to the Media Rally Point Needs to be identified as quickly as possible after the event becomes public knowledge Needs to be manned by officers to direct parking, keep unwanted visitors out, and secure the area from unauthorized entry May need nearby area for helicopter landing/lift off

Preplanning Helps Create a map for each school in your jurisdiction For each school identify all of the locations with an Option A and Option B (at a minimum) Identify traffic access concerns: Access to and exit from the location(s) Identify areas of concern for high-traffic volume hours (rush hour) and what detour(s) might need to be created Pocument and review each school plan on a regular basis and train with your senior staff / allied command officers
